

Rutherford, Johncock Trade Blows Following Race

PHOENIX AP—Sunday's Jimmy Bryan 150-mile race for Indianapolis type cars was sanctioned by the U.S. Auto Club.

But the fight afterwards was strictly Marquis de Queensbury.

Johnny Rutherford, who posted an 18.5-second victory, and old rival Gordon Johncock, who finished 12th after a controversial spinout, were just into the first round of an amateur bout

when referee Ray Marquette, a USAC official, stopped the fight, with Rutherford bleeding slightly from a cut nose.

The nose-tittle bout started after Johncock accused Rutherford of running him off the track 94 miles into the race.

"Little man," Rutherford said, "if you can't stand the heat, get out of the kitchen."

Johncock glared back and vowed, "If you ever get close to me again I'll put

you over the fence."

Rutherford, in the process of giving the press an interview, said, "Okay fellas, you all heard it, didn't you?"

In a flash, Johncock hammered Rutherford with a blow to the nose and one to the neck, which also partially caught Marquette in the face.

Johncock stalked off. Rutherford, with as much dignity as possible, then finished the interview.

"What Gordy said works two ways. If he makes a move on me, I'll have to defend myself," Rutherford promised.

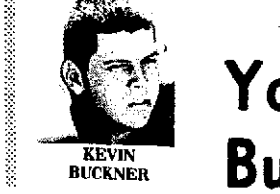

Bulls On Rampage; Lakers 1 From Title

The Chicago Bulls' charge to the National Basketball Association playoffs continues in high gear.

The Bulls, considered dead after stumbling to a 2-14 record in the opening month of the season, reached a milestone on their comeback trail Sunday night when they beat the injury riddled Cleveland Cavaliers 95-90 before a crowd of 19,757 at Chicago Stadium.

The victory, coupled with Kansas City's 139-129 loss at San Antonio earlier Sunday, lifted the Bulls one-half game ahead of the Kings in the race for the sixth and final playoff berth in the Western Conference.

Seattle, the third team in the scramble, lost to Phoenix 121-100 and dropped 2 games back.

"I don't want to think about the playoffs just yet," said Bulls Coach Ed Badger, "even though I know we have momentum. We have three top teams

meeting us—Philadelphia Tuesday, Boston Wednesday and Denver Friday. I hope we'll have enough momentum for the playoff stretch."

The playoff picture in the West now looks like this:

Chicago, 39-35, leads Kansas City, 37-38, by one-half game and Seattle, 37-38, by 2 games. Chicago has eight games remaining, four at home; Kansas City has seven games left, two at home, and Seattle has seven games to go, five at home. Los Angeles Lakers are only one win from clinching their division title and continue to lead the race for best record and home floor edge in the playoffs.

Elsewhere in the NBA Sunday, the Detroit Pistons beat the Houston Gockets 115-100, the Boston Celtics trimmed the New York Nets 114-109, the New York Knicks defeated the Washington Bullets 109-95, the New Orleans Jazz nipped the Indiana Pacers 119-118 in double overtime, the Philadelphia 76ers topped the Portland Trail Blazers 128-116, the Denver Nuggets defeated the Golden State Warriors 115-109 and the Los Angeles Lakers beat the Buffalo Braves 92-89.

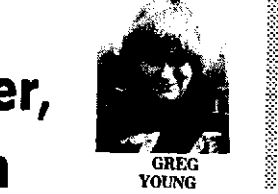

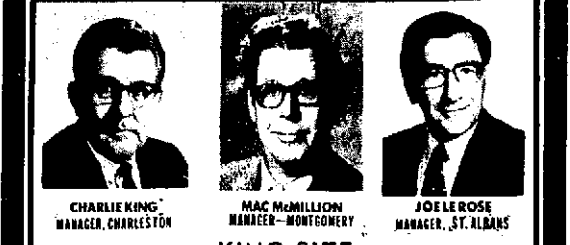
