

Ripley Works Overtime To Edge Sissonville, 6-0

Senior running back Allen Raines bulled over right guard on the third play of Ripley's overtime series to give the Vikings a 6-0 win over Sissonville's hard-luck Indians Saturday afternoon at Joe Sawyers Field.

Raines' clutch touchdown came after Roger Winters had slanted to the five on the Vikings' first play in the overtime. Raines slammed the middle for two and followed wedge blocking to nudge over the goal line on third down.

"The key was getting a big five yards (by Winters) on our first down," commented first-year Ripley coach Frank Marino. "Raines is our OT man. He's a clutch player." Raines scored a touchdown in overtime earlier this season to beat Hurricane.

Sissonville had first crack at winning the Lions Club trophy as Ripley won the coin toss and elected to go on defense in the overtime. A five-yard offside penalty on first down severely hurt the Indians' chances. Chuck Coffman rushed for two yards and Gary Britton fired two desperate incomplections. On fourth down, Tom Young's 30-yard field goal attempt was low.

"Our defense played a super game," Marino said. "Tackles Henry Lanham and Kevin Lee were outstanding. Linebacker Gordie Ball also had an outstanding game. Offensively, tackles Lee

and Tim Merritt gave us lots of daylight. It's great for the town and school to get the Lions Trophy back. It's been six years, you know, since we've beaten them."

The Vikings consumed most of the first quarter by controlling the ball for 10 minutes on a penalty-plagued 19-play march to the Sissonville 21. On fourth and six, quarterback Jerry Ocheltree's sideline pass skipped off Mitch Carmichael's hands at the ten.

Midway in the second quarter, Lanham fell on a Sissonville fumble on the Indians' 47. Sissonville couldn't capitalize and gave up the ball on downs. A stiff Ripley defense kept the Indians' wishbone attack in check throughout the first half, keeping the Indians from crossing mid-field.

Sissonville controlled the third quarter after stopping Ripley on downs on the Indians' 39 with Britton's fumble recovery halting the threat. Reserve halfback Duane Haynes sparked a Sissonville advance to the Ripley 16 early in the fourth quarter. On fourth down,

Britton scrambled to the 11 but was knocked out of bounds with 9:44 remaining in the game and Ripley took over.

The Vikings moved into Sissonville territory where Indians' tackle Ken Boggs fell on a fumble on the 35 to stop the Ripley threat.

Ripley mounted a final threat in regulation time from their 20. Driving into Sissonville territory behind the rushes of Raines, Winters and Carmichael, the Vikings moved to the Sissonville nine. On fourth and one, an offside call against the Indians gave Ripley first and goal on the four with 34 seconds left in the game.

After an incomplete pass, Boggs came up with another timely fumble recovery as Carmichael lost the ball on the last play of regulation time.

"Our boys played their guts out," sighed Sissonville coach Forest Mann. "These kids worked like the devil all week in practice. They may have been defeated but they haven't beaten badly any time this year. Our school and community should be proud of these young men."

Winters paced the Vikings attack with 75 yards on 13 carries while gritty linebacker-fullback Chuck Hissom marched 30 yards for Sissonville.

Nitro Nips Dunbar 16-13 With Rally

Nitro came alive in the second half Saturday to grab a 16-13 victory over Dunbar at Underwood Field.

The Wildcats, trailing 13-3 at half, started to move in the third period with Duane Snyder in at quarterback. Snyder replaced starter Jimmy Henson at the start of the second half.

Nitro took the second-half kickoff and drove 70 yards in 12 plays to cut the margin to 13-9. Snyder capped the march with a 15-yard touchdown pass to Gene Duffield. Snyder's passing highlighted the drive with his passing. He was three-for-three with 43 yards.

Nitro took the lead for good early in the final period, moving 78 yards in seven plays, for the touchdown. Don Haynes scored the T.D. on a three-yard run.

The victory ended a four-game losing streak for Nitro. The Wildcats won their first two games but then lost their next four.

DUNBAR JUMPED into the lead on

its second possession of the game when Sam Henderson burst loose for a 59-yard T.D. run.

Nitro also scored on its second possession on Jeff Oldham's 29-yard field goal.

Mark Mason scored on a 19-yard run early in the second quarter to put the Bulldogs up 13-3.

Individually, Henderson led all rushers with 139 yards in 17 carries. Mason had 55 yards in five carries. Tim Cowan, seeing action at quarterback for the first time since recovering from an injury, completed two of seven passes. J.R. Carney was one-for-two.

For Nitro, Haynes had 57 yards in 18 carries. Kevin Phillips 43 yards in seven carries. Snyder 27 yards on six tries.

Dunbar gained 154 yards rushing in the first half, but the Nitro defense limited the Bulldogs to 48 yards in the final half.
