## Parkersburg Back in Playoff Picture With 34-0 Win Over S.J.

Mighty Parkersburg High moved back into the thick of the Class AAA playoff race Saturday night with a convincing 34-0 victory over outmanned Stonewall Jackson at Laidley Field.

The Big Reds simply whipped Stonewall where it counted the most—along the line of scrimmage as three Parkersburg backs ran for over 100 yards through the giant holes opened up by the interior linemen.

Speedy John Richards led Parkersburg's rushing parade with 136 yards

and a touchdown. Fullback Frank Pirillo picked up 106 yards and scored three times and sophomore reserve Larry Gibson rambled for 101 yards.

As a team, Parkersburg gained 362 yards on the ground and tacked on 11 more through the air.

On the other side of the slate, it was a long, long night for Stonewall. The Generals could account for only 58 total yards, 29 rushing and 29 passing. Stonewall had only two total yards at the half.

Stonewall came after Pirillo's second touchdown. Junior Adolph Johnson took the kickoff and raced 87 yards for a touchdown. The play was called back, however, for an illegal block.

Stonewall's defense picked up at the outset of the second half as the Generals stopped the Big Reds cold in the third quarter. But Stonewall couldn't hold the Big Reds for long.

The Big Reds took over the ball on the first play of the fourth quarter when Richards intercepted a Scott Shores pass. Parkersburg then reeled off a time-consuming 16-play drive that resulted in another touchdown for Pirillo, this one from the one.

Gibson, who carried the ball only one time in the first half and only six times in the game, when over the 100 mark late in the game when he took off on a 60-yard run down to Stonewall's three-yard line. Reserve Barry Nutter then got the touchdown on a sweep.

LEXINGTON, Ky. — Derrick Ramsey ran for two touchdowns and passed 45 yards to Felix Wilson for another score Saturday night as seventh-ranked Kentucky ripped Virginia Tech 32-0.

Kentucky, 7-1, took control of the game when a Virginia Tech scoring opportunity went awry midway through the second period. Kentucky's Mike Siganos returned Paul Engle's 62-yard field goal attempt to VPI's 45, and on the next play, Ramsey launched the touchdown bomb to Wilson for a 10-0 halftime lead.

The Cats blew the game open during a five-minute stretch late in the third period. Ramsey scored on runs of 22 and three yards, giving Kentucky a 22-0 lead.






